

# SAFETY RULES

## MUNICIPALITY

### Employee Safety

Municipal employees are exposed to various hazards ranging from automobile to electrical accidents while serving our community. Implementing safety rules will benefit both employees and tax payers.

#### WorkSAFE Tips

- Employees must wear seat belts when driving on company business and operating machines or forklifts.
- Passengers in vehicles must wear seat belts.
- Do not operate vehicles or machines when fatigued.
- Report to work free from the aftereffects of drugs or alcohol.
- Report maintenance needs or hazards before the end of your work shift.
- Report incidents or injuries in writing immediately.
- To reach items, use a proper foot stool or ladder and never stand on chairs, tables or desks.
- Keep building fire exits, extinguishers and pull stations clear, unblocked and unlocked.
- Report problems with fire exits or emergency lighting.
- Report problems with ice, snow and water.
- Know your severe weather shelter locations.
- Clean up spills and hazards that could cause a slip, trip or fall.
- Do not run.
- Wear hearing protection in noisy areas.
- Wear appropriate slip-resistant footwear when working.
- When doing extensive computer work, take short breaks, stretch and report issues early.
- To prevent ejection and entrapment, wear seat belts when using all equipment with ROPS.
- Perform a safety walk-around prior to moving vehicles or machines on the job site.
- Inspect construction machines and tools for hazards or maintenance concerns before use.
- Do not operate machines or equipment unless you have been trained and authorized.
- Wear an approved hard hat when working on construction job sites.
- Wear eye and face protection when using power or hand tools or when near flying objects.
- Wear a reflective, high-visibility vest when working near traffic or construction machines.
- Stay ten feet away from overhead entrances and power lines.
- Scan for overhead power lines before raising ladders, dump beds or booms.
- If exposed to a fall, you must be protected by guardrails, a safety net or a personal fall arrest system.
- Use three-point contact when climbing ladders and when mounting or dismounting trucks or machines.
- Workers must be protected by trench sloping, shoring or shielding.
- Do not enter confined spaces without atmosphere testing, communication, rescue plan and retrieval equipment.
- Never climb into dumpsters to compress or dig by hand through job site waste.
